Cllr. A. Thomas reported that she had met with the new District Cllr. M. Gower regarding changing the night of the meeting. It was agreed not to change the meeting night as the village hall has other activities booked on the other nights of the week.

7) <u>To receive information and agenda items for the Parish Council Meeting</u> to be held on Monday, November 12th 2018:

Cllr. A. Niven said that the leaflet had been distributed along the A144 Main Road, Low Road and Thorington Road. He said that copies would also be left in the Bramfield's Public House, Shop and Garage. Cllr. A. Niven also reported that the leaflet had been sent out electronically as well.

8) Traffic Report on A144:

Cllr. A. Niven said that Suffolk Highways will make a decision on the traffic calming proposal at each end of the Bramfield but he reported that he did not know when.

Cllr. A. Niven said that he had a long conversation with Sexual Parish Cllr. N. Ellis who said that from Penhall's experience, buffer zones do not make any difference. Cllr. A. Niven said that he was not sure about a number recognition system as much work was needed to make it work. He said that 140 000 vehicles travel along the A144 through Bramfield every month with 85% travelling over the speed limit.

9) <u>Bramfield Bus Shelter and Telephone Box:</u>

Cllr. D. Hughes said that the glass had not been bought yet as she wants to get the invoice sent to the Clerk. It was noted that Bramfield Garage would help.

Cllr. A. Thomas said that she had met with the new District Cllr. M. Gower to discuss whether he could contribute to the cost of the renovation. She said that Cllr. M. Gower had agreed to make a contribution but he could pay for all of the costs. It was reported that a parishioner had said that they would pay for the residual costs. Cllr. A. Thomas noted that the Bus shelter needed some Swift Boxes so that they could nest in them.

10) Village Hall:

It was reported that the Harvest supper had gone very well indeed. Cllr. A. Thomas apologised for not being at the supper.
