The Council does not have any objection to this planning application.

Nevertheless the Parish Council does have some observations. Parishioners already report that the smell from the current chicken sheds is very strong every few days and believe that more chicken sheds will bring even more smell, flies, dust and noise from the fans. There is also a concern over the pollution from the ammonia and water finding its way to the River Blyth to affect the wildlife including the otters that live further down the river. The poultry farm started on small scale but has gradually grown to the extent now that the Parish Council wonders if the business is getting too large for the site especially as this planning application is a

40% increase to what is already a nuisance to the parishioners who live nearby. Therefore it must be asked as to whether they should suffer further distress from the expansion of the plant. The Parish Council would like to ask East Suffolk Council to take these issues into consideration and to create conditions in the planning application to mitigate these issues to the neighbours.

7) Traffic Report on A144:

Cllr. A. Niven said that a neighbour had received a response to their Freedom of Information Request. He said that Suffolk County Council Highways had informed him that the 40mph 'buffer' speed limit would go ahead at the top of the hill out of Bramfield and that the 40mph 'buffer' speed limit out of Bramfield towards the A12 would be consulted upon. Cllr. A. Niven said that Speedwatch would carry on gaining the data useful to the consultation. Finally Cllr. A. Niven reported that he had met with the police and had been told that there were many items of equipment available from collapsed speedwatch initiatives.

8) Bramfield Bus Shelter and Telephone Box:

Cllr. A. Thomas reported that the Bus Shelter had opened on Saturday, June 6th 2019 at Noon with its new thatched roof. Unfortunately she said that June Brereton had not been able to open the bus shelter but Cllr. A. Thomas was able to report that the thatchers and their families had been in attendance. Cllr. A. Thomas said that she had a plaque with a commemoration on it which was agreed to be put it up high up inside the Bus Shelter.

Cllr. A. Rozkalns reported that he would be clearing out the cigarette butts out of the telephone box so that he could get the rivets out of the windows for their replacement.

9) Village Hall:

Cllr. A. Rozkalns reported that Suffolk County Council had noted and would be repairing the potholes on the road past the Village Hall. He also said that the numbers of pupils at the Pre-School and the Primary School were down on previous years as the birth rate had declined.
